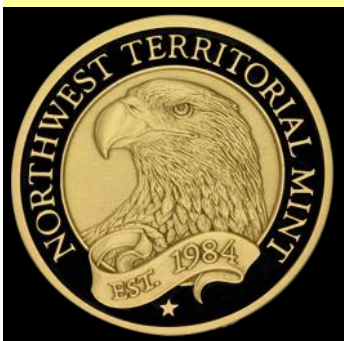

“THE BOULE”

Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, also known as the BOULE, is the first Greek-letter fraternity to be founded by African American men. Significantly it's members already have received college and professional degrees at the time of their induction. The fraternity's insignia is the Sphinx.

From the beginning, Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity was a learned society, a social fraternity and an advancement organization. The founders' devotion to equality and mutual respect stemmed in large measure from the devotion to democratic traditions that they traced to ancient Greece and to the traditions of leadership that existed among free men.



W. E. B. DuBois was an American sociologist, historian, civil rights activist, Pan-Africanist, author and editor. After completing graduate work at the University of Berlin and Harvard, where he was the first African American to earn a doctorate, he became a professor of history, sociology and economics at Atlanta University. DuBois was one of the co-founders of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) in 1909.
